Accessible Voting in Guernsey

This guide explains how to vote at a polling station in Election2016

Where do I go to vote?

Polling Stations are often at Parish Halls or well known locations in Guernsey.



What time can I vote?

All other Polling Stations

Polling Stations are open from 8am - 8pm.



St Sampsons

St Sampson's Polling Stations are open from 10am to 8pm.



What happens when I get there?

You will be asked by an official for your name and address.

You can prefill a name and address card beforehand, these are available from The Home Department.

You will then be given a ballot paper with the names of everyone you can vote for.

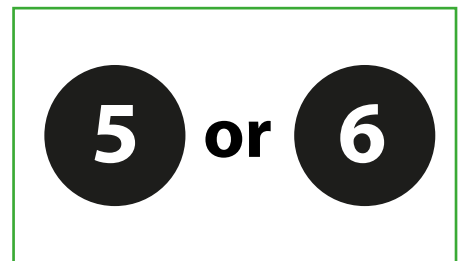


You then will go into a voting booth where you can place your votes.



Depending upon where you live in Guernsey you will have 5 or 6 votes to place.

This number will be on the top of your ballot paper.



Draw a **X** in the box for each person you want to vote for. Then fold your paper and place it in the box



What if I need help?

There will be people working at the Polling Station who you can ask for help. You can ask them to read and explain the ballot paper. They can help you fill in your ballot paper.

You can also go to your Polling Station with your support worker. They can help you to fill in your ballot paper.
